

Courage Callback Preparation Checklist

Now that your assembly date is set, you will need to complete each item in the checklist below to ensure the success of your presentation. If you have questions, please call us at 952.922.0222 or toll-free at 888.992.0222.

Please note: This follow-up assembly is not interactive in the same manner as our standard programs. Students are expected to remain seated during the assembly experience.

1 Select a facility

We strongly encourage you to hold your Courage Callback follow-up assembly in your school's auditorium or similar setting.

- Ideal locations are school or community auditoriums with fixed seating.
- Please arrange to have the location opened at least 1 hour before the audience arrives to allow the Youth Frontiers staff to set up.

2 Prepare the space

Please provide the following for our staff 1 hour before the assembly begins:

- Open “performance” space for the speaker to facilitate the activities
- One eight-foot table (rectangle)
- Chairs (row seating) are ideal; but students may sit on the floor if necessary
- One or two extension cords, if necessary

3 Prepare your students

Please give your students an idea of what the assembly will entail so they walk into the room prepared for the experience.

- The assembly is not like a retreat experience. (In other words we will *not* be playing mongo volleyball.)
- We will be asking them to call back to their retreat experience. Ask them to reflect on back on their Act of Courage.
- We are excited to be working with them again!
