### financial summary from the 2019-20 fiscal year

As it did for so many other nonprofits, businesses and households, COVID-19 created unexpected financial hurdles for our organization. We estimate that we lost out on serving about 12,370 students and educators when more than 100 of our previously scheduled, in-person retreats became impossible to facilitate. However, during this tumultuous time, we stewarded our financial support responsibly, shoring up our resources, cutting expenses, and taking critical action to secure a Paycheck Protection Program loan. In the end, we still impacted more than 107,600 people through nearly 750 retreats and experiences. We could not have done this without our generous supporters who are committed to our mission, committed to community and committed to character.






